District of Moidart

Moidart (“muid”-sea spray and “ard”-height, means Heights of the Sea Spray.

The etymology of the word Acharacle is “Ath Thorguil” or “Torquils Ford” which comes from the Danish leader who invaded the district of Corran against Somerled and was defeated on the banks of Loch Sheil.

The invaders crossed the river at the ford opposite the village of Acharacle. They made a vigorous stand but during then battle their leader Torquil was killed.

Acharacle is within the border of Argyll and Inverness, shires on the coast and lies 11 miles North West of Strontian and 2 miles North of Salen at the western end of Loch Sheil.

In 1879 the Parish had two public schools, Acharacle had the accommodation for 90 children and Eilanshona respectively had accommodation for 35 children.

In modern times the village is under the Lochaber region of the Highland Council area.

The village is surrounded by mountains, Beinn Resipol rising to 845m (2,274 feet) nearby.

In Acharacle there is a Parliamentary Church designed and built by William Thomson in 1829-33.

The District of Arisaig and Ardnish

Astley Hall was designed by Philip Webb and built in 1893 presumably paid for by the owners of Arisaig House.

Keppoch House was built in about 1800 for Alexander MacDonald of Glenaladale, father of the man who built the Glenfinnan Monument.

The house is a two storey main block with single storey wings, the right-hand wing, originally a byre.

St Mary's Roman Catholic Church was designed by William Burn and built in 1849. The clock tower was added in 1928 in memory of Alastair MacMhaigster Alastair, the Gaelic poet who was buried there in the graveyard. There is also a fine Presbytery house.

Lochailort on Locheilside has a Roman Catholic Church built in 1874 in an isolated position, designed to be visible from Lochailort House. Now disused.

Inverailort House is a Georgian farmhouse converted to a shooting lodge by the construction of baronial additions at both ends in 1875 and 1891. The house was used as a base for Commando units during WW2.

Jutting out into the Sound of Arisaig is the small rugged Ardnish Peninsula which separates Loch nan Uamh from Loch Ailort. Twisting through the peninsula is a three mile path which leads to the southern beach at the abandoned settlement of Peanmeanach. All that is left amid the ruins is one restored building maintained by the Mountain Bothies Assoc.(MBA)

Peanmeanach means in the Norse system of land division i.e.

An ounceland was a large area of land thought capable of producing enough for an ounce of silver in rent.

Each ounceland was divided into twenty pennylands of farms.

The other element of the name “meanach” in Gaelic, means “middle”

Peanmeanach is a corruption of Peathan Meadhonach.

Peanmeanach settlement and was one of the larger settlements in the 1890's.

The last resident at Peanmeanach, Nellie MacQueen (The Schoolteachers daughter) left during or very shortly after the WW2.

Slochd is a ruin settlement which lies about 3 km Northwest of Laggan.

Laggan settlement lies in the East side of the peninsula and only the ruins remain. The family of MacLeod's were the last to leave Laggan in the late 1960's.

Glasnacardoch settlement lies to the South of the peninsula near to Peanmeanach.

The district of Ardnish was almost cleared of all people in 1940 to allow the training of the Commandos in WW2.

In 1970 there were only two permanently occupied houses on Ardnish.

Castle Tioram is the Clan seat of Clanranald MacDonald's and lies at the mouth of Lochmoidart and was held by the Clanranald MacDonald' between the 14th and 18th Century.

Amy (*amie nic Ruairidh macrory*) who was married to John of Isla improved the already existing castle in about 1353.

John of Isla (*righ innse gall*) (Lord of the Isles) died in 1380.

Ronald MacDonald

Born 11th... February 1912

Married 11th October 1941

Died 23rd November 1975

Ronald was born on the 11th February 1912 at Achreaoch (*Achriabhach*) Cottage, Glen Nevis, in the Parish of Kilmallie, Near Fort William, Inverness-shire, youngest son of Lachlan MacDonald B 1870 and Flora MacDonald B 1874.

Ronald and Marion married on the 11th October 1941 in the West End of Glasgow at St Peters RC Church Hillhead by Father Thomas Kelly and Witnessed by William MacDade of 3 Hawthorn Drive, Shotts, Near Glasgow and Nan Cumming of 22 Rutland Crescent, Glasgow.

At the age of three Ronald suffered badly from damage to his windpipe when he left his sister's side Flora MacDonald who was watching him one day as their mother Flora MacDonald attended to milking cows in the byre. Ronald ran to the hen run and grabbed a handful of the grain and swallowed the grain. Flora his sister tried to get the grain out of his mouth but failed to get all of it out. Flora ran to her mother Flora in the cow byre to tell her of the Incident.

Ronald's mother Flora then ran to the hen run and turned Ronald upside down to try and shake out the grain from Ronald's mouth. Ronald started to turn blue in the face and gasping for breath. This caused damage to his breathing tubes. Throughout Ronald's life he suffered from severe Asthma and Bronchitis.

Ronald with his Sister Flora, brothers Angus and Johnny all walked 4 miles to Banavie School and 4 miles back each day and did not always wear their tackety boots until they left school. Ronald left Banavie School in 1926 at the age of 14.

On most occasions Flora, Angus, Johnny and Ronald walked to school in their bare feet. The family moved to Annat Cottages in Corpach on the golf course where Ronald and his brothers Angus and Johnny were always known as "Angus the Golf", "Johnny the Golf" as well as Ronnie the Golf"

They had between them a Harley Davidson Motor bike which they rode up from the back of the cottage into the forest to shoot Deer and then straddled the deer across the pillion seat of the Motor bike. Then ride the bike back to the cottage where the deer would be slaughtered and quartered and salted away for the winter. In 1927 Ronald

started working on the public roads with his brother Johnny, learning to drive a Tarmac roller and similar plant of the like used on tarring roads and drainage work.

From 1929 for the next eight years Ronald worked on notable projects in the Lochaber area. British Aluminium Hydro Power Station in Fort William and the Loch Laggan Hydro-Electric scheme.

At the start of 1937 Ronald worked on the roads around Oban and stayed there obtaining a job driving Alexander Bluebird buses in the district of Oban.

One of the bus routes ran from Oban South Pier passing St Columbia's Cathedral towards Ganavan Sands passing one of the big white houses where Marion worked as a housemaid.

They met and decided to move and work in Glasgow on the SMT Buses.

They lived at 16 Blackie Street in Partick in the West end of Glasgow near to the Kelvin Hall.

They both worked for SMT (Scottish Motor Traction) with their red buses from Waterloo Street Bus Station in Glasgow, running in a westerly direction towards Clydebank, Dalmuir, Old Kilpatrick, Dumbarton, Bonhill, Cardross and Helensburgh. The buses also ran to Alexandria, Bonhill and Balloch.

Ronald was employed as a Bus driver and Marion was a Bus Conductress (known in the city of Glasgow as a "Clippie")

Ronald and Marion's family of -

Lachlan born 1942

John (Iain) born 1944

Rhona born 1947

Malcolm born 1950

Florence born 1953

After the war in 1945 Ronald swapped jobs of driving to work at the Blackburn factory in Dumbarton driving Bedford Square Nose long articulated flat bed lorries that carried Prefabs around the country to the cities where the buildings had been bombed in the German campaign in WW2.

The Prefabs were in three parts on three Lorries.

The White Prefab houses were used to replace the demolished buildings in many parts of Northern England and Scotland

After the Prefab work Ronald worked at the Pitlochry Power Station in Perthshire and stayed with Morag Henderson's parents in Killin as well as the Construction workers camp at Port n Craig Pitlochry. The camp was adjacent to the river Tay.

Ronald also worked on the Loch Sloy Hydro-Electric Scheme on Loch Lomond side in 1948 and to the completion in 1950. There was two large construction camps; one for the British workers and several miles north at Inverglas was another camp for Polish and other East European workers'.

The Power Station was opened in 1951 by Queen Elizabeth the late Queen mother. Later in 1948 and again in 1956 Ronald worked at Barclay Curle's shipyard at Scotstoun and Yarrow's at Yoker as a crane driver in the shipyard which was for the construction of new Dry Dock berths for large ship building and refits rather than traditional ship building.

Another large construction where Ronald was involved was for John Menzies Co, the large stationery and publishers who decided to have a new type of building constructed for their head office in Glasgow. The building was built in 1960 and was one of the first multi-storey office buildings in West Nile Street, Glasgow. Ronald operated the Mono-tower crane for Sir Robert MacAlpine. There were very few of this type of crane in the country at the time.

This type of crane was the forerunner of the modern Tower cranes that are now used in building multi-storey buildings. It could be seen on the Glasgow skyline from all directions.

In recent times a similar Mono-tower crane is situated in the Plant yard of Sir Robert MacAlpine on the A14 near to the town of Kettering in the Midlands of England.

This crane was a Henderson derrick, had a Drivers cabin sitting at 175ft with a 129ft jib fitted.

A local Construction project nearer to home was the Dumbarton Gas Works where Ronald drove a Butters derrick crane (125ft Jib) with triple electric motors fitted for operating Slew, Hoist and Jib Out at the same time. Another innovation in the crane industry.

In the years of 1960 to 1964 Ronald started a taxi business in Old Kilpatrick with a black Austin 16 Reg No SX6592 and later added a FX3 London Black Cab Reg No PUV164.

Ronald also had for a short time a 1935 Austin 18 Black saloon which was built like a tank. Similar to the cars you would see in the American films. At one time Ronald was driving the car towards Whiteinch in Glasgow when the cobbled main road was very wet. The wheels got caught in the tram lines and when Ronald braked hard the car ran into the back of a luxury touring coach hitting the rear of the coach spilling many suitcases onto the road. Big damage to the coach. When the Car was reversed back from the coach there was absolutely no damage to the front of the car.

This was a diversion from working the long hours where construction companies expect from their employees as they say" make hay while the sun shines"

With his health not the best Ronald enjoyed this type of work and his love of driving.

In 1963 on his doctor's advice Ronald went on holiday to Devon to warmer weather with his family of Marion, Malcolm and Florence. They stayed with Marion's brother, Donald and Ruth in Cullompton at the Maiden Down Stage Petrol Station and café on the Exeter A38.

The temperature was rather warm in Devon although the holiday was most enjoyable. On the return journey from Devon the family stopped off at Warrington due to tiredness and stayed the night there.

On the following day the family travelled to Blackpool and stayed near the Promenade for several nights. It was excellent for Ronald with the sea breeze and clear air from the seaside.

They ventured around the coast to nearby Cleve leys and the fishing port of Fleetwood. The improvement of Ronald's breathing and all-round excitement of feeling good the family even spent time looking for a house that would be available for sale in Fleetwood. The house at No 48 Milton Street, Fleetwood was looked over and all agreed it was right for the family.

On their return to Old Kilpatrick in the September it was decided by all the family to move down to Fleetwood in the following year 1964.

Arriving in January at 48 Milton Street which was a 6 bedroom house and costing £1,800 to buy, we set about making improvements to the house with a view of taking in Bed and Breakfast.

At the same time Ronald started in the January with Sir Alfred MacAlpine at the ICI Bond Works at Thornton as a Minibus Driver. Ronald stayed until the contract was complete at the ICI Bond Works.

In 1965 Ronald started up a Taxi company called "2000" with 5 cars which eventually reached the height of 32 cars, running it for eleven years until 1974 and due to Ronald's poor health sold his share to his partner.

Ronald continued working with his own Taxi for a short time after he sold out and suffered poor health for the remainder of his days.

In between driving his Taxi, he worked as doorman for Stan Mortenson the famous Blackpool Footballer of the 1953 FA Cup Final who scored a hat-trick in that FA Final. Ronald knew all the punters and odd bodes of Fleetwood as they came in the door. Great asset to Stan in preventing any trouble in the club which was called The Sportsman's in Dock Street, Fleetwood.

Being a member of the Royal British Legion, he enjoyed his bingo and an occasional pint. He loved driving and also had possessed many cars in his life.

Ronald died in Blackpool Victoria Hospital on the 23rd November 1975 aged 63,
with Cardiac Failure, Athero Sclerosis and Right Hemiplegia with Chronic Bronchitis.
Service was at St Mary's RC Church Lord Street, Fleetwood.
Interred in Fleetwood Cemetery, Fleetwood.

Marion MacDonald

Born..... 24th January 1918

Married... 11th October 1941

Died..... 7th July 1989

Marion was born on the 24th January 1918 at Kilmore Farm, Melfort, Kilmelford near Oban, Argyllshire.

Only daughter to John Hugh MacDonald and Flora Steele MacDonald.

Married on the 11th October 1941 to Ronald MacDonald b 1912.

Marion (Morag) was born on the 24th January 1918 at Kilmore Farm, Melfort, Kilmelford, near Oban and went to school at Kilmore, Kilmelford where Marion achieved the highest award of the school, the Gold Dux Medal. (The Best Pupil of the School)

On leaving school in 1933 Marion left Kilmore and worked as a house maid in the big houses of the gentry at Garth House, Fortingall, Perthshire (1936), Corran Ferry Hotel, south of Fort William in 1938, Inverawe House near Taynuilt in 1937 and at Ganavan Sands near Oban about 1939-40.

Marion met Ronald from Corpach, near Fort William in 1940 who at the time was driving buses in Oban and both left to live in Glasgow in 1940 to work on the SMT (Scottish Motor Traction) buses running out of Waterloo Street in the city centre westwards to Alexandria Helens burgh and Balloch.

They both lived at 16 Blackie Street just off Dumbarton Road in Kelvingrove near to the Kelvingrove Museum.

In the 1941 Glasgow blitz, their tenement flat in Blackie street was bombed and lost all their possessions. All they had left was the SMT uniforms they were wearing at the time. Ronald and Marion left Glasgow and moved to a tenement ground floor flat with two bedrooms at Glenend, 73 Dumbarton Road in Old Kilpatrick about 15 miles west of Glasgow.

Both Ronald and Marion worked on the red buses of SMT from Gavinburn Garage in Old Kilpatrick as Bus Driver and Bus Conductress (known as a clippie in Glasgow)

The family stayed at Glen-end No 73 Dumbarton Road a three storey tenement until 1950 then moved to a newer house at 12 Freeland's Crescent at the other end of the village, it being a Prefab with three bedrooms and having a good back garden to grow vegetables.

Then in 1953 the family moved to a larger house at No 99 Roman Crescent which was at the other end of the village near to the village of Bowling.

Ronald's and Marion's family of-

Lachlan John, eldest son was born on 10th August 1942 in the Glasgow Maternity Hospital (known locally as Rotten-row Hospital)

John (Iain) second son was born on 28th May 1944 at 73 Dumbarton Rd, Old Kilpatrick
Rhona eldest daughter was born in March 1947 at 73 Dumbarton Rd Old Kilpatrick and sadly died in infancy at 10 months with Pneumonia. Rhona is interred with Marion's parents at Muckcairn Church in Taynuilt, Argyllshire.

Malcolm third son was born on 28th October 1950 at 12 Freeland's Crescent, Old Kilpatrick.

Youngest daughter Florence was born on 28th February 1953 at No 99 Roman Crescent, Old Kilpatrick.

Now that Florence was attending school in 1958 Marion took part time work at the house called "High Over" located above Bowling for a Mr and Mrs Kirk.

Mr Howard Kirk was the owner of Alexander Transport, a large transport company that supplied bulk Sand and Gravel throughout the West of Scotland. With the war ending in 1945 rebuilding Glasgow and surrounding districts there was a massive demand for the raw materials like Sand and Gravel.

Mr Kirk had a female employee who specialised in Premix Concrete which was used extensively in the ballast to large ships. It never bothered her to go into the bowls of any ship to survey the work requirements

Known in the construction trade within the Glasgow district as "The Concrete Queen"

At one time Mr Kirk had over one hundred Lorries on the road.

A notable construction project that Alexander's were responsible for in the 1920's was the Singers' Sewing machine factory in Clydebank.

Many workers engaged in the construction of Singers factory were imported from Ireland. The Labour work force numbered upwards of 3,000 and almost all earth and spoil was removed from the factory foundations by shovel to horse and carts.

In 1920 there were few Lorries available for this type of work.

In January 1964 Marion with the family all moved to No 48 Milton Street, Fleetwood and settled in to renovate the house in readiness for taking in Bed and Breakfast in the summer months and to take in several boarders to assist with the running costs in the winter.

One of the boarders was Big Joe who stayed for a few years in the top room.

Malcolm left school in 1966 and took up his apprenticeship as a Motor Mechanic with the Lighthouse garage, they being the local Ford dealer in Fleetwood.

Several years later, Florence reached school leaving age in 1968 and went to work in a local jeans factory.

Marion continued with the boarders etc until Florence got married in 1969 and Malcolm had completed his trade in 1971.

It was decided that the house was becoming too big for both Ronald and Marion under the circumstances so it was put up for sale for £3,000.

When it was sold, Marion and Ronald move to 216a Lord Street into a two bedroom Flat. They stayed there until Ronald's death in hospital in 1975.

Marion moved after Ronald's death from the flat and went to live with her daughter Florence and Raymond in their house in Addison Rd, Fleetwood.

As Florence bought and sold several houses in Ettrick Ave, Milton Street and Fleetwood Rd, Marion moved with them on each occasion until her death in 1989.

Many times Marion travelled abroad to France, Italy, Austria Switzerland, Belgium, Holland and Spain, with the Catholic League and The Catholic Church of St Mary's Fleetwood. Marion visited Lourdes several times as well as Knock in Ireland.

Her great friend Mrs Heap of Fleetwood accompanied Marion on many of the trips including the annual trip to Aylesford Convent in Kent.

When Marion took ill on Monday 5 July 1989 and was admitted to hospital in Blackpool her view was to get me out of here and home.

On the Wednesday 7th July Marion's condition deteriorated rapidly and sadly passed away in the morning aged 71.

Lachlan MacDonald

Born 6th November 1870

Married.... 5th June 1903

Died.... 27th March 1927

Lachlan was born on the 6th November 1870 second son of Ronald MacDonald and Flora MacDonald.

Lachlan was born at Glasnacardoch, Ardnish in the District of Moidart.

Lachlan married on the 5th June 1903 at the Registry Office in Glasgow to Flora MacDonald who lived temporarily at 61 Grove St Milton Glasgow.

It would appear that Flora travelled to Glasgow to get married.

It was also recognised that Cattle Driving around that time at the turn of the century earned good money with cattle driving and the Drovers would stay in the cities of Glasgow and Edinburgh to spend up and maybe get married.

Flora came from Acharacle, Ardnamurchan and travelled to Glasgow to marry Lachlan, however the reason is unknown of why the marriage was conducted in Glasgow by the Sheriff of Lanarkshire and Peter Grant a Police Constable who was one of the witnesses to the marriage. It has been said it was classed as an Irregular Marriage as the marriage was conducted outside the areas of both Lachlan and Flora's normal residence.

Lachlan's sisters were Jo-Ann born 1863, Christina born 1869 and Jessie born 1874.

His Uncle Samuel was born in 1829 and lived with the family.

Samuel was unmarried (*census1861*)

On leaving school Lachlan worked as a Shepherd at Torlundy, Fort William.

He also worked at Fassfern, on Locheil-side for the Cameron family.

Other areas he worked at were Knapdale Forest, Dundardy and Batavamie near Killin.

Black Cattle droving and driving sheep to the sales at Falkirk, Crieff, Perth and Glasgow were undertaken depending where the best prices were being paid.

After getting married Lachlan and Flora went to live in Ardnoe, St Catherine's near to Kilmorlich in Argyll-shire.

St Catherine's was a major ferry port for cattle droving from the Western Highlands to the southern towns.

Angus and Flora their first son and daughter were born at Ardnoe, Argyllshire.

In 1908 Lachlan, Flora, Angus, Flora and John (Johnny) lived at Batavaime farm in Glen Lochay some 20 miles north of Clarinlarich. Lachlan was employed as a Shepherd.

When living at Batavaime farm, Donald MacDonald born 1828 in Ardnish aged 80 widower and Malcolm Brown born 1863 in Killin, single and both were boarders.

Later 1911, Lachlan and Flora went to live at Achreaoch (*Achriabhach*) Cottage, Glen Nevis, where Lachlan worked as a shepherd in Glen Nevis under the peak of Ben Nevis. The cottage is located high up in the glen and is positioned next to the stream on the left hand side of the road just before the road bridge.

In fact it is the highest living accommodation in Glen Nevis.

The family of -

Angus eldest son was born in 1904 at Ardnoe, Kilmorlich, Argyllshire

Flora only daughter was born on 17th July 1906 at Ardnoe, Kilmorlich, Argyllshire

John second son was born 1908 at Batavaime, Glen Lochay, near Killin Perthshire

Ronald youngest son was born 11th February 1912 at Achreaoch Cottage, Glen Nevis in the District of Kilmallie Fort William

Lachlan and family on leaving Achreaoch Cottage in Glen Nevis around 1912 moved to Annat Golf Cottages near Corpach, Near Fort William. Adjacent to the cottages was the-
*The 9 Hole golf course called "*Rudha mor*" in 1905 to 1939.

Destroyed by the Admiralty in 1939 to construct a tarmac road along the fairway.

Mr Sutton from England (origin bought the Caledonian Warehouse in Corpach in 1950)

Developed the site into a large caravan site called Linnhe Caravan Park.

South west corner of the caravan park lived a MacDonald who was a heavyweight champion boxer of Scotland or Great Britain.

Lachlan opened a Butchers shop at the Corpach Pier where meat including venison was slaughtered and sold to the gentry and the general public.

He ran the shop for several years however he later returned to driving cattle and sheep from the Highlands to the markets in the main southern towns.

Lachlan had a very good knowledge of animals and was always in demand as a Vet.

He also had a considerable knowledge of the Gaelic folklore and was a member of An Cunn.

Whilst shepherding sheep to the markets around the country, Lachlan was exposed to the elements of the weather on the east coast of Scotland at St Andrews.

Lachlan had a habit of sleeping outside with the flock when droving and where he could have he would have a sheep wrapped around his neck and shoulders whilst he slept.

Sadly Lachlan was found on the foreshore suffering from exposure between the high sand dunes and died on St Andrews Golf Course on the 19th March 1927.

The headstone in St Mary's RC Church Arisaig was erected in his memory by his only daughter Flora MacDougall. Also in-scripted on the headstone is John (Johnny) his son who was lost at sea in July 1942 in WW2.

Lachlan died aged 56 on 27th March in the year of 1927 at St Andrews, Fife-shire
Interred at St Mary's RC Church, Arisaig, Inverness-shire alongside his wife Flora.

Married to Lachlan MacDonald on the 5th June 1903 at the Registry office in the district of Milton, Glasgow.

The marriage was witnessed by Police Constable Peter Grant and Flora MacIntyre, occupation, Drapery Warehouse woman.

Flora's father John MacDonald, Crofter was deceased at the time of her marriage. Her mother Ann was still living.

Flora married Lachlan at the Registry Office on 59 Port Dundas Street in Glasgow on the 5th June 1903.

Flora before her marriage worked as a domestic servant in Acharacle.

Her sisters were Christy born 1868 and Peggy born 1872

Her Brothers were Alexander born 1847 and Angus born 1857/67 were both agricultural Labourers.

Flora after her marriage lived with John and family in Ardnoc, Kilmorlich near St Catherine's Argyll, Fassfern on Lochail side, at Dundard and Inverloch, Fort William. Ann lived in 1908 at Batavamie Farm near Killin, and later in 1912 in Glen Nevis and eventually at Annat Cottages, Corpach until her death in 1942.

Angus In his bachelor days lived at Achreaoch, Glen Nevis and later at the Golf Course Annat Cottages Corpach where now near to the cottages lies a large caravan site.

Angus was known as "Angus the Golf" like both his brothers, John (Johnny the Golf) and Ronald the Golf and his sister Flora the Golf.

Angus and Annie when they first got married moved to Langdale near Mingarry in Ardnamurchan and later moved to Strome Farm Dalmally, later to Invernenan Farm Loch Lomond-side and latterly to Be-Ach Farm near Lochaline working as a Shepherd.

Angus with his family lived at Be-ach Farm, Lochaline in 1967.

James Anthony (Hamish) their first child was born in 1940. Angus was working as a Road Foreman on the Kinlochleven road from Glencoe which ran along the south side of the Hillside of Loch Leven.

The German Prisoners of war spent some years on the building of this road which served the British Aluminium Smelter Plant and the town of Kinlochleven.

During his retirement Angus went back to No 8 Dalnabreck, Acharacle Moidart to live for several years at the original croft house of his Grandfather's called -**

*"Taigh n itear" "ticheanfbivhoadair" ** (taken from a letter by Angus in 1975)-meaning "Tie neacher"-ch as in church which means "House of the Weaver.*

Angus's Grandfather was Ronald MacDonald a Wool Weaver and Crofter in the District of Ardnamurchan,

In 1969 Angus when he retired with Annie his wife moved to Glasgow to live with James Anthony (Hamish) their only son where sadly Angus died in 1977.

The Croft house is now known as the Moidart Smokehouse run by Jimmy Gillies (son of Archie Gillies) with his wife Alice.

The relation of Jimmy Gillies to Angus is that Angus's wife Annie's sister, Sarah who was a teacher married Archie Gillies one of the family of 13 from Scammadale.

When Angus died in 1977 in the Royal Infirmary Glasgow Annie his wife after several years in Glasgow decided to move to London in 1980 where several of her family were living. Annie lived at Northolt Middlesex with her daughter Joanne (Mary Ann) until her death in 1991.

When Angus died in 1977 James brought his father back to be buried at St Mary's RC Church in Arisaig. Angus is interred in the outside graveyard.

Angus died on the 28th July 1977 aged 73 from Renal Failure and Prostatic Carcinoma.

Annie his wife registered his death in Glasgow recorded as a Retired Shepherd.

Last Address recorded was No 8 Dalnabreck, Acharacle.

It has been said that this is the reason why Angus was buried outside the St Mary's Church Graveyard as it was due to this child being unofficially buried in the family grave inside the old graveyard which surrounds the church.

Angus and Annie when they first got married moved to Langdale near Mingarry in Ardnamurchan and later moved Strome Farm Dalmally, Invernenan Farm, Loch Lomond-side and latterly to Be-Ach Farm near Lochaline.

When Angus died in 1977 several years later in 1980 Annie went to London and lived there with Hamish and Joanne until she died in November 1991.

Annie's sister Sarah, who was born in Glenfinnan, married Jimmy Gillies, one of a family of 13 from Scammadale. Sarah was a Schoolteacher. Her father Archie Gillies was the schoolmaster at Glenfinnan School house.

Archie's son Jimmy moved to Dalnabreck and started the Moidart Smokehouse in 1994 at the Old Weavers Croft.

The Moidart Smokehouse is still in operation in 2012 with great success especially with their products on the internet.
